

International Academy of Trenton Moves to Permanent Campus

The International Academy of Trenton Charter School (IAT), a SABIS® public charter school located in New Jersey, U.S., recently moved to its permanent campus.



IAT opened in 2014 and welcomed 354 students in Kindergarten through Grade 3. Housed on a temporary campus while the search was underway for a permanent location, the school grew to an enrollment of 535 students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 and outgrew its facilities.

In February 2017, however, the school moved to a permanent home in the former *Trenton Times* building. Once a historical fixture in the city, the *Trenton Times* building stood empty after being vacated by the newspaper in 2011. In the years that followed, the building began to crumble from disrepair, its windows boarded up and graffiti covering the walls. That was until the building was acquired in 2015 by Highmark School Development and identified as the permanent home for IAT. Since then, the 80,000 square foot, mid-20th century building and the six acres it stands on have been undergoing extensive refurbishment and are now ready to function as a 21st century school.

The school and campus are now home to IAT's current students and offer ample opportunity to accommodate up to 1,200 future students as the school gradually continues to expand its offerings to include Kindergarten through Grade 12.

Along with helping students build a solid academic foundation, SABIS® Network schools prepare students to engage as independent, lifelong learners, a quality that is becoming more and more essential with the exponential rate of change in the world today. The SABIS® Interactive Learning System $^{\text{TM}}$ (ILS $^{\text{TM}}$) is one of the tools developed by SABIS® and used in the network to help nurture students as independent learners.

The ILS™ is a learning platform that streamlines the learning process by connecting students and teachers through digital devices (tablets) in the classroom. At the start of an ILS™ lesson, students log in to their tablets and read through the explanation of a particular point or topic. Once they have read through the explanation, they move on to complete a set of questions associated with the point. As students in the class answer the questions, the ILS $^{\scriptscriptstyle\mathsf{TM}}$ software allows teachers to actively monitor each student's performance and take appropriate action based on real-time mastery. Equipped with the knowledge of exactly which students have accurately applied a concept and which have not, the teacher can decide to offer further explanation of the point or opt for additional examples to ensure that all students in the classroom are learning. When the teacher has established that all students in the classroom have sufficiently understood the point, he or she moves on to the next point.

"ILS™ promotes real-time learning and develops students' capacities as independent learners, giving teachers on-the-spot information about individual student mastery and empowering students to be the driving force in the learning process," explained Ghassan Kansou, SABIS® VP – Academic Development.

 ILS^{\intercal} is currently implemented in SABIS® Network schools in Lebanon and the U.A.E. in levels E through L (typically grades 3-10). To date, ILS^{\intercal} lessons include mathematics, science, and

English grammar, with the French and Arabic recently launched at the SABIS® International School – Adma in Lebanon. Plans are underway to launch ILS $^{\text{TM}}$ across the network gradually.

There are numerous examples from around the SABIS® Network of just how valuable and effective Shadow Teaching® is:

At the International School of Choueifat — Lahore (ISC-Lahore) in Pakistan, Shadow Teachers® acquire necessary skills throughout the year. They practice public speaking and leadership skills, which assist them in delivering the material in a classroom setting. They also learn how to organize content so that it can be taught in an effective and efficient way. Having acquired the skills needed, Shadow Teachers® at ISC-Lahore have a specially-designated event in which to showcase their skills: Shadow Teachers® Week. From October 24-27, 2016, and on November 1, 2016, over 200 ISC-Lahore Shadow Teachers® in grades 2-12 successfully led lessons.

During the workshops, Shadow Teachers® are trained to teach English, math, science, and Arabic under the supervision of their teachers and school staff.

to give back to their school and make a difference in the lives of students.



Academic Achievements

ISC-Amman is a member of the global SABIS® Network and implements the SABIS® Educational System $^{\text{TM}}$, a comprehensive academic program that has been developed and refined for over a century. The system gives students a solid foundation of knowledge and skills that prepare them for success in a changing world.

ISC-Amman offers a challenging, college-preparatory curriculum that prepares students for a wide range of external examinations - Advanced Placement® (AP®), Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), and Advanced Level (A Level). Outstanding performance of ISC-Amman students on these external examinations has gained the school and its students public recognition. In fact, in February 2016 under the

patronage of His Royal Highness Prince Mired Bin Ra'ad, the school held a "High Achievers Award Ceremony" for students who achieved top scores in the world and in the country. Awards went to 30 ISC-Amman students who fulfilled one of three requirements: (1) earned an A* or A on IGCSE or A Level exams, (2) earned full grades in the SAT subject tests and 2,000 points or more out of 2,400 on the SAT I, or (3) scored 5 on AP® exams.

In November 2016, 19 Queen Rania Outstanding UK Learner Awards were presented to 10 ISC-Amman students for achieving top scores in the world and in the country on A Levels and IGCSEs.

Outstanding external exam performance coupled with a solid foundation of knowledge and skills position ISC-Amman graduates for acceptance to top universities in Jordan, the MENA region, and around the world. ISC-Amman graduates from 2015 and 2016 are pursuing their studies at Johns Hopkins University (U.S.), SOAS University of London (U.K.), Hotel Institute Montreux HIM (Switzerland), the University of Jordan (Jordan), and the University of British Columbia (Canada) to name a few. Their choice of undergraduate programs covers a wide range of areas including social media, architecture, medicine, hospitality management, engineering, art and design, political science, and biomedical engineering.

An Active and Engaging Student Life

In addition to offering an outstanding education, ISC-Amman offers students a rich and engaging student life. Through the SABIS® Student Life Organization® (SLO®) at the school, students benefit from a wide range of clubs, activities, and extracurricular activities that allow them to develop new skills, explore new interests, and learn the value of being active contributors to their communities. Some of the clubs and activities offered include Model United Nations (MUN), Lego®, and public speaking; academic events including spelling bees, "Wheel of Math," and Jeopardy®; sports like soccer and basketball; and activities, such as the very popular "Door Decorating Contest," "The Amazing Race," and "Blue Monster" night.

In the summer of 2016, SLO® prefects set up a summer internship program that gave ISC-Amman high school students the opportunity to complete an internship in well-reputed companies, banks, law firms, and hospitals. According to Rakan Al Majali, a Grade 11 student who participated in the internship program, "It was an enriching experience. It helped me realize that my passion toward medicine is genuine. The

program allowed me to access certain sections within the hospital that I had never been to before, such as the operating room, endoscopy section, and the ICCS. I would definitely recommend this program to all the high school students. Joining the program was one of the best decisions I have made."

The ISC-Amman SLO® is also committed to making a difference in the lives of others. One of the best examples is the Habitat for Humanity project. In coordination with <u>Habitat for Humanity Jordan</u>, a non-governmental organization (NGO) that "helps build strength, stability, and self-reliance through shelter," ISC-Amman 9th graders volunteer to improve the housing and living conditions of low-income families in Jordan. 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
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
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
