Under the patronage of his Highness General Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Alumni / AE Association (MITAA) hosted the 4th Annual MIT Pan-Arab Conference 2003: Human and Economic Development on June 14 and 15, 2003 in Dubai, UAE.

The main theme of the conference was the Human and Economic Development Through Technology, Policy, Business, Health and Education. Topics covered interactive discussions on Challenges and Prospects of Research and Development in the UAE and the Arab World in the New Millenium, Investment and Economic Development, Global Oil Dynamics and

Diversification of Oil Dynamics, Redefining the Research University, Moving beyond Tradition, Winning Leadership Strategies and Transforming the Education Landscape in the Middle East. Among the distinguished guests present at the meeting were Ministers of Higher Education and Research, MIT professors and alumni, renowned CEO's and experts from major fields of work.

SABIS[®] was invited to participate in the Pan-Arab Conference. Mr. Ralph Bistany, Director General of the SABIS[®] School Network, was a keynote speaker, among a panel of four to address the issue of *Global Educational Reform* and he spoke on *Transforming the Education Landscape in the Middle East.*

Mr. Bistany highlighted the need for a *"Renaissance in Education."* He reiterated some of the dominant ideas in education, such as spending more money on education, reducing class size, individualized teaching, involvement of teachers in curriculum and testing, parental involvement,

He stated that all these issues should be scrutinized very carefully, for money is not a solution, small classes are not more efficient, students need frequent breaks (and hence longer school days) and constant testing and memorization are key to academic excellence.

Mr. Bistany's speech also focused on *Education as an Industry*, along with his belief that Education should be subjected to the rules of efficiency and accountability, should be rewarded for success and pay the price for failure. Mr. Bistany also stressed the privatization of public education, explained some of its existing forms, and touched on the major problems faced by the educational sector; these problems, as underlined in his speech, were universal and not unique to the Middle East region.

The 4th Annual MIT Pan-Arab Conference ended on a productive note. By way of professional speakers and dynamic workshops, the conference succeeded in highlighting several vital global issues and helped clarify a vision for the future.
